Judy Beck, RN, MSN, Director of Quality Improvement Program Director for Quality Health Associates of North Dakota Subcontractor Member Representative

Ms. Beck has been employed with Quality Health Associates of North Dakota (QHA-ND) since 2013. With over 30 years' experience as a registered nurse with special interest in patient safety, quality improvement, quality assurance, medication safety, and medication reconciliation, Ms. Beck currently serves as QHA's Quality Improvement Program Director and the State Program Director.
