MDS Tip/ Resources – Section GG

What is Section GG? The intent of Section GG in the Resident Assessment Instrument (RAI) is to assess a resident's functional abilities and goals. It includes items focused on prior function, admission performance, discharge goals and discharge performance based on the need for assistance when performing self-care and mobility activities. Documentation in the medical record is used to support the coding of Section GG. Accuracy is very important as several quality measure scores and CMS Five Star Ratings are directly related to Section GG assessments.

CMS has released several new Section GG resources designed to improve understanding and how to code accurately. These resources are not only helpful to the MDS coder, but could be used in educating your certified nursing assistants and nursing staff.

Free! Computer Based Training Program on Infection Control Practices

Creating a culture of safety with [Partnering to Heal](#) is designed for clinicians, health professional students and patient advocates. Partnering to Heal is a computer-based, video-simulation training program on infection control practices. Users assume the identity of five main characters and make decisions about preventing health care-associated infections (HAIs). Objectives focus on the prevention of surgical site infections, central line-associated bloodstream infections, ventilator-associated pneumonia and more. In addition, it includes information on basic protocols for universal precautions and isolation precautions to protect patients, visitors, and practitioners, creating a “culture of safety.”

This site is coordinated by the Office of Disease Prevention and Health Promotion, Office of the Assistant Secretary for Health, Office of the Secretary, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.



Holiday Quick Tips for those Living with Dementia

With Christmas quickly approaching, it can be tempting to idealize nursing home visits – particularly if your loved one is suffering from dementia or Alzheimer's. The nature of the diseases makes family members want to believe their loved ones will be just a bit better. Long-term care staff often spend more time with the residents they care for than their own family. As staff, share your knowledge with the person living with dementia's family members as to what you know about their routine, their sure-fire smile makers, their dislikes, their best time of day so family can visit at that time!

- During visits, use slow and gentle motions. Smile. Keep lots of eye contact. Go along with your loved one's stories, rather than arguing or negating them. Join them in their reality.

- If possible, visit with someone else. Review the facility’s policy on pets and children – they can help brighten a loved one’s day.
- Keep in mind that people with Alzheimer’s and dementia thrive on routine. Keep visits low-key and uncrowded.
- If you take a loved one home, remember to keep his or her medications handy. Consider wearing nametags. Once at home, try to engage your loved one in gentle, low-stress activities. Ideas might include baking cookies, stringing popcorn garlands and creating photo albums.

The holidays can be a wonderful time to reconnect with elderly family members. If you put a bit of extra time and effort into the reunion, the visits will be that much more rewarding.

NHSN Tip from the Frontlines: NHSN Point of Care (POC) Testing Module

“We use the NHSN Point of Care Test Module and I find it very simple and a time saver. Getting the initial information logged in of the residents and staff takes a little time but after that, it is just keeping up on inputting the testing results. I find it quicker than submitting via our Department of Health portal for the POC testing data. It probably takes me 5 minutes to manually input the test result data directly into NHSN under the POC test Module. There is a search button that will automatically find those people you are retesting and since we don’t have that much of a change in residents and staff, it has not been a problem keeping up.”
