## **Speakers**

### **CHARLENE BERKE**

Charlene Berke started her career in Radiology Grand Forks, North Dakota where she attended the University of North Dakota in 1985. In 1990 she then advanced her career to become a certified Radiation Therapist graduated from the Mayo Clinic's School of Health Related Sciences. After completing her training, as a Radiation Therapist her first job in therapy was at a hospital in Grand Forks, ND as Chief Radiation Therapist. In 1997 after a devastating flood she relocated to Brainerd, Minnesota to establish the radiation therapy department for Minneapolis Radiation Oncology (MRO). Then in September of 2000 another opportunity presented for her to start a new cancer program for Avera in Mitchell, South Dakota. She successfully started the program and received an Outstanding Achievement award from the American College of Surgeons Commission on Cancer for the program in 2003. Her career at Avera expanded to include the Yankton, SD cancer program and she was asked to start a Palliative Medicine in 2018. Palliative Medicine quickly became her new passion. She had the opportunity to apply and received two federally funded grants from Human Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) which is what she is currently doing.

Her past work includes exploring decision making in women with early-stage breast cancer and perceptions and knowledge of palliative care. Currently, she is co-project director of a statewide network which is working to improve knowledge of palliative care in nursing students, healthcare professionals, and the community throughout the region. Dr. Mollman is PI on a study to adapt and test an early palliative care intervention for rural patients with advanced cancer and their family caregivers. If successful, she plans to broaden the intervention to rural patients with other serious illnesses and their family caregivers.

### **MARI PERRENOUD**


