Mary Belford, MD, General Psychiatrist, Riverside Medical Center and Indian Oaks Academy Corporate Member Representative

Dr. Belford is a General Psychiatrist at Riverside Medical Center in Kankakee, IL, and Indian Oaks Academy in Maneno, IL. She has nearly 30 years of experience of consulting with and serving patients. She is Board Certified by the American Board of Psychiatry & Neurology. Dr. Belford has also served in teaching appointments, currently as the Director of Psychiatry Residency at Riverside Medical Center since 2019. She received her B.S. in Biology from Carroll College in Waukesha, WI, Doctor of Medicine from the University of Illinois, and completed her residency at the University of Texas at Houston.
